REMINDER TO STUDENTS: WATER SAFETY

- Weaker swimmers and young children should always wear a lifejacket or personal flotation device – this is not a substitute for staying within arm's reach.
- The best way to be safe in or near the water is to learn to swim.

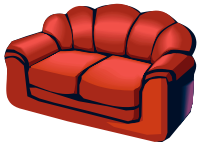

NEWS FROM GRADE 6

The school year seems to be flying by, literally, as we began our final Science Unit on Flight. Our visit to the Manitoba Aviation Museum last week gave us an exciting hands-on Flight Introduction, as we explored two hangars full of civilian, military, bush and even supersonic aircrafts. We were able to board an old passenger plane and go on an aviation scavenger hunt. After a quick lesson in aerodynamics, we designed models from recycled materials, exploded them in a stress test, then explored the unique Airfield playground before returning home.

Our 6 Literature Circles groups have made presentations to their classmates on their novels, with each member performing their Plotmeister, Researcher,

Psychologist, and Illustrator jobs. As well, they constructed either a Board Game or Diorama to represent their story. Gr. 6 students have also been busy constructing a Survey and corresponding Graph to display their knowledge in our Data Management Math Unit.

These items, as well as a few Flight demonstrations, will be featured and displayed at our WBS Learning Showcase on Tuesday, June 7th.



NEWS FROM GRADE 7

June is not only a busy month at school for Grade 7 but also a special month as it is the last month of school at WBS for most, and hopefully all Grade 7 students!

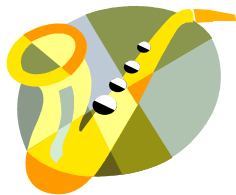

Balanced School Day

Thank you to all the families that returned our survey. We have approximately 100 families in our school and over 50 forms were returned! Of the families that returned their forms, 35 agreed with the BSD structure, 17 were undecided and 2 felt it was not the best way to go. We appreciated all the feedback. We are moving ahead with the BSD structure with a positive attitude and are looking forward to giving it a go.

Here are the answers to some of your questions:

How long are the breaks?

Nutrition break 1 is 15 minutes long followed by activity break 1 which is 20 minutes long. Nutrition break 2 is 20 minutes long followed by activity break 2 which is 35 minutes long.

Will we get feedback on how it is going?

Yes, we will do a February and May check –in with students, parents and staff. We will need to decide by early May of 2012 whether to continue.

What happens in cold weather?

We will follow the same guidelines we have followed in the past around indoor recesses. On colder days, we may do a shorter time outside and the rest inside.

Why weren't we consulted more beforehand?

A couple of things played into how much the parent community was involved. One reason was that the timeline was sped up. Originally it was on our list of things to think about for September 2012 but we learned that of the 4 schools in our Division with EY or EY/ MY combinations (Riverton Early Middle, Arborg Early Middle, SSES in Gimli and us), we would have been the only one not on this structure. Being on the same structure allows for easier scheduling of meetings around the Division and allows us to problem solve around concerns together. Another reason is that essentially it is an internal change. It will affect teachers more than it will students / parents. Students will start and stop school at the same times, they will still bring food to school, etc. Another reason is it is very hard to give feedback on something until you experience it. The feedback we will gather next year, especially from the staff and students (but also from parents) will give us the best indicator if this was a positive change.

What if my child eats slowly?

Although the eating time is shorter there will now be 2 eating times for students to spread their food equally over. Based on our current lunch supervision and what other schools have shared with us, they will have enough time.

Will schedules be given out?

In the older grades (grades 5, 6, 7) most teachers give out timetables at the start of the school year. In the younger grades teachers usually let parents know which days are gym, music, library etc., via a classroom letter at the start of the year.

How long are the time slots? Is more time being spent on subjects?

There are three 100 minute learning blocks each day. Some of those blocks are broken up with gym, music and library classes. We will continue to use the subject time allotment guidelines from Manitoba Education to plan our timetables. Subject blocks may be longer. For example instead of Science being taught 3 times a week for 30 minutes, a teacher may take a 60 minute slot one day (especially helpful for project work) and a 30 minute slot another day; the BSD allows for more flexibility.

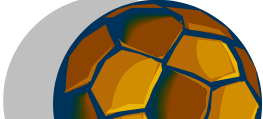
